Adventures in American History Megan Robinson 2-4 th \$10	Basic School supplies and a folder. I may also ask for a few items to be sent in for certain crafts throughout the year. \$10	This is a fun, hands-on approach to American History! We will be using literature, videos, activities, lots of crafts, and snacks to dive into history starting with the Viking explorers and ending with the Civil War. This class is ideal for 2 nd -4 th grade but could extend to 5 th .
Algebra 1**** Tricia Holbert 8-12	Math U See Student workbook and the teacher pack which includes answer book and instructional DVD. Students will need this material in order to check their work during the week to make sure they are understanding the material. The DVD is useful if students miss a week or need to refresh at home.	Students will need to have an understanding of operations using integers (positive and negative numbers). Algebra 1 assumes this is already mastered. We will learn algebra concepts including graphing, simultaneous equations, exponents, polynomials, unit multipliers, and more.
Algebra 2**** Carey Parham 9-12	Math U See Student workbook, pencil, 3 ring notebook for completed work, quizzes, and handouts, and the teacher pack which includes answer book and instructional DVD. Students will need this material in order to check their work during the week to make sure they are understanding the material. The DVD is useful if students miss a week or need to refresh at home.	***Success in this course is dependent upon a successful completion of algebra 1. This algebra 2 course is designed to build on algebraic and geometric concepts. It develops advanced algebra skills such as systems of equations, advanced polynomials, imaginary and complex numbers, quadratics, and concepts and includes the study of trigonometric functions. It also introduces matrices and their properties.
American Sign Language Aleah Holbert 4-7th	Basic school supplies, 3-ring binder	Will give a beginning level understanding of ASL. Will be able to hold simple conversations and vocabulary. No prerequisites except basic reading level.

Bible Project Classroom **** Chris & Rob Ellis 9-12 th	Bible Project app, Bible, Notebook, highlighters, journal, the book "How to Read the Bible"	This will count as a high school Bible credit using The Bible Project app and Classroom portion of their amazing free resources.
Biology 101**** Rachel Farmer 9-12 \$40	Basic school supplies, a 3-ring binder, computer with internet access \$40 per student for supplies	This is a college-prep high school biology course, using the textbook Exploring Creation through Biology, 3rd edition, by Apologia. We will go through the book from microbes to man, studying how organisms work with a special emphasis on how our topics affect our health and wellness, as well as how the complexity of creation demands a Creator. Again, this is a college-prep course, so students should budget significant time each day working on the class (doing readings, studying, watching online lectures, or completing assignments). Students need to have access to a computer to be able to watch online lectures and access our student folder. We will be doing some lab work, including dissection.

Geometry**** Tricia Holbert 8-12	Math U See Student workbook The teacher pack which includes answer book and instructional DVD. Students will need this material in order to check their work during the week to make sure they are understanding the material. The DVD is useful if students miss a week. 3-ring Binder, pencil	Prerequisite: Algebra 1 I love math, and I love getting the opportunity to share that love with students! My desire is that each student learns and understands the math concepts taught in this class. Because the students are only in class for 1-2 hrs per week, it will be important that parents partner with me for this course. I am always available throughout the week to help students if they do not understand, but I have found that students do not usually reach out without a parent's prompting. It is important that parents are making sure their student is staying on top of their assignments and understanding the material. This Geometry class will give your student a basic understanding of the following concepts: describing points, lines, rays, line segments, angles, planes, calculating the measure of the interior and exterior angles of a regular polygon, understanding the geometry of shapes, understanding and computing volume and surface area of solids, using the Pythagorean Theorem to identify triangle attributes and more.
Government/Economics*** Jason Napier & Jessica Beauchamp 9-12 (1/2 + 1/2 credit)	American Government 4 th Edition-BJU Press- ISBN: 978-1-62856-424-2 Notebook/binder Economics: Exploring Economics student book 2016 edition	This is a high school level for credit course. This course will provide students a broad overview of the foundations of and how our government works. We will review primary documents throughout the semester that will provide students with information written by people who actually lived the events that we are studying. Students will have required reading from the text each week and will have weekly homework assignments, notetaking is strongly encouraged. Students will earn ½ credit of US Government at completion. Key Economics concepts will be explored and applied. Required weekly reading, homework assignments, or projects. There will be quizzes along the way.

In this theme-based writing curriculum, students will write about exciting topics such as the Bayeux Tapestry, tsunamis, Jerusalem and the Crusades, and other interesting subjects while they learn to write with the Structure and Style writing method.
IEW: Following Narnia 1*** Angie Harper 8-12	IEW Following Narnia Volume 1: The Lion's Song (student book only)	Using the first three novels of The Chronicles of Narnia (The Magician's Nephew, The Lion, the Witch, and The Wardrobe, and The Horse and His Boy) this series of 30 lessons beckons students to experience the enchanted land of Narnia through the Structure and Style writing method. The student book gives reading assignments from the novels, source texts on related topics, checklists, assignments, and more!
IEW 2: Following Narnia 2*** Jackie Daley 9-12th	Binder, tabs dividers, pencils, pen, HS: ISBN: 978-1-62341-253-1 (student and teacher book)	Continue the adventure with the remaining four novels of The Chronicles of Narnia (Prince Caspian, The Voyage of the Dawn Treader, The Silver Chair, and The Last Battle). Students will learn advanced writing skills while exploring the enchanted land of Narnia through the Structure and Style writing method. This course is recommended for students with at least one year of experience with IEW.
Intro to ASL Andi Horstkotte 8-12 th	3-ring binder or folder, basic school supplies	In this introductory class to American Sign Language, your student will learn the most common word signs for every day communication using ASL. This class is interactive as we work together learning a new language! Each class will end with a quiz to help retain what we've learned. There will be few unit test throughout the school year as well.

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		Also included: basic deaf culture, terminology, history, fingerspelling, and numbers. Knowing the ASL alphabet is encouraged but not a requirement as I will review it in class.
Intro to Public Speaking Annelise McKeehan 9-12 th \$50	Pencil, paper, and supplies covered through the fee. \$50 (covers high school grading, IEW's Intro to PS binder and Student Packet)	In this course, high-school students learn memory and delivery techniques as they write and present five speeches: self-introductory, narrative, expository, persuasive, and impromptu. This course is worth ½ of a high school credit even though it spans a year.
Jiu Jitsu Noah Delaney K-5 \$50	Kids in shorts that tie (or leggings with shorts over them) and T-shirts \$55	Students will learn Brazilian Jiu-Jitsu and have skills practice.
Learning Through Literature* Kim Stanley K-2 \$15	\$15/year - The fee covers the craft/activity materials. Basics: pencil, crayons, colored pencils, scissors, glue, plus a Take Home folder	We will be following a Five-in-a-Row-inspired curriculum to work on our letters while learning about our world through literature and activities! Each week, we will read and discuss a book, talk about that week's letter, and do an activity or craft that goes with the story. The fee covers the craft/activity materials.

Math Enrichment Renee Duffield 3-5 th	Basic school supplies	Students will receive instruction and practice elementary mathematics. We will use manipulatives, play games, and practice core skills for elementary math, including number fluency, addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, and word problems. Special attention will be given to any concepts that are proving to be a struggle in your math curriculum at home (parental input about troublesome topics will be especially helpful!). This will not serve as a replacement for at-home instruction, but rather as a supplement for improving math comprehension.
Math Enrichment Renee Duffield 6-8 th	Basic School supplies	Students will receive instruction and practice middle-school mathematics. We will use manipulatives, play games, and practice core skills for middle school math, including multiplication/division fluency, long division, ratios/proportions, fractions, decimals, percents, mental math, word problems, and pre-algebra. Special attention will be given to any concepts that are proving to be a struggle in your math curriculum at home (parental input about troublesome topics will be especially helpful!). This will not serve as a replacement for at-home instruction, but rather as a supplement for improving math comprehension.
Math Enrichment Renee Duffield 9-12 th	Basic School supplies	Students will receive instruction and practice high school mathematics, including Algebra, Geometry, Algebra 2, and Trigonometry. Special attention will be given to any concepts that are proving to be a struggle in your math curriculum at home. (parental input about troublesome topics will be especially helpful!). This will not serve as a replacement for at-home instruction, but rather as a supplement for improving math comprehension. This will not provide a high school math credit but can be used as an elective. This will be a fun and engaging environment to help empower them and reduce math apprehension. But good work ethics and attitudes will be required.
Math Meets Art* Kristine Adams 3-6 th \$20	Basic art supplies including; pencils, markers, ruler, colored pencils, compass, scissors, and glue sticks \$20 fee	In Math Meets Art students will be combining art projects with strengthening math skills. The goal of this class is making math into activity instead of worksheets. Math is more than just numbers and this class aims to help kids grasp math concepts by getting creative and at times messy!
Middle School General Science** Erica Gillis 6-8 th \$30	Safety goggles, glue sticks, colored pen or pencils, notebook for taking notes. We will be using Apologia's <i>Exploring Creation with General Science, 2nd edition</i> . Purchase of the textbook is recommended, but not required. \$30	This course is designed to be used as a student's first introduction to the higher sciences. General Science will cover a wide range of topics including the scientific method, geology, anatomy, physiology, and more. In-class time will include labs, experiments, interactive lecture, and the creation of a detailed lapbook to help students think like scientists and view science from a Biblical perspective. We will be using Apologia's <i>Exploring Creation with General Science, 2nd edition</i> . Purchase of the textbook is recommended, but not required.

Additionally, half the class each week is dedicated to learning about composers and a little history about their life and time period.

Children need to be able to read and write without any help and be able to research topics.
PE** Emile Finstad 4-7	No special equipment needed but comfortable clothing and tennis shoes are required for each class.	Working on basic exercise and workouts and learning how to do sick body weight exercises correctly. No special equipment needed but comfortable clothing and tennis shoes are required for every class. Students must be willing to participate. Students will also be expected to exercise at home. I will offer exercise suggestions. But we will be racking the students fitness progress throughout the year so my hope is that the child will learn some new exercise and implement them at home in their daily lives.

We learn life skills that can be applied now and through adulthood.

Poetry Tea Time Kelsey Beanblossom K-2	Basic school supplies and a folder	In this creative class, your student will enjoy a cup of tea or juice, listen to and learn a poem, and make a craft.
Poetry Tea Time Rebecca Burgener 3-7 th	Paper and writing utensil	Drink tea, read classic poetry, write poetry, and publish a class book. Students must be able to write independently, but perfection is not required.
Private Piano Lessons Esther Heneise Any level/ 7 yo and up \$20 per lesson	\$20 per lesson Piano books and a notebook and a full length keyboard with pedal or working piano to practice on at home.	I am offering private piano lessons. No prior experience necessary. Age 7 and up. It will be necessary to purchase some lesson books. These are paid lesson and the fee will need to be paid at the beginning of each month. There will be a recital at the end of each semester. We will cover the classical music style, learning to read musical notation and studying music theory. We will also learn how to play with chord charts, by ear, and by rote memory. 50 minute lessons.

Please make sure your child is prepared for this class by having them take the placement test on the Math-U-See website. This class will move fairly quickly with lessons/homework needing to be completed at home between classes. The teacher can be available by phone/text/FaceTime as needed for help with assignments between classes. Recommended grade levels are 7th and 8th.
Scripture Alphabet* Rebecca Burgener K-2	Basic School Supplies	Scripture Alphabet will be using a curriculum called Rising Rock Stars Kindergarten. Each week we will study a letter from the alphabet, a Bible verse that goes along with that letter, a little phonics, a little math, some sight words, writing, and more.
